Specific Admission Requirements

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution in one of the following content areas:
 - For K-12 licensure: art, foreign languages, or instructional technology
 - For secondary (7-12) licensure: agricultural education, business education, English, family and consumer studies, marketing education, mathematics, science, social studies, speech, technology education, or trade and industry education
- Completed all content areas required for licensure
- GRE scores are not required

Program Completion Requirements

- 41 graduate level credits must be completed for the teacher licensure and master's degree
- A student teaching internship is also required

Time Frame

This program can be completed in one year. Summer courses required for completion. As a cohort program, the same group of students begins and completes the program together.
